Discounted Registration Rate for Dairy Producers

Thanks to grants and support from the Center for Dairy Excellence, registration fees for dairy producers and all farm employees from any state are set to be as affordable to farm operations as possible. Considering the challenging economics in the industry, the Center for Dairy Excellence is committing an additional \$50 for all dairy farmers so producer registration is only \$100 for the first registrant and \$75 for each additional person from the farm.

Scholarships Available for Qualified Young Professionals

The Center for Dairy Excellence, Dairy Excellence Foundation and Pennsylvania Dairymen's Association will award a limited number of scholarships to attend the 2025 Pennsylvania Dairy Summit.

Through this scholarship, your conference registration will be discounted to \$50, you will receive a complimentary hotel room stay with additional same-sex scholarship recipients, and will be paired with an industry mentor who possesses the career path in which you have interest.

Requirements:

- Be between the ages of 18 and 25 as of February 1, 2025 OR an adult who serves as an advisor or professor of agriculture at a high school, college, or university.
- Operate or work on a dairy farm or enrolled in an agricultural degree program at college or trade school OR be enrolled in an agriculture program at a high school OR teach agriculture at a high school, college, or university.
- Be a resident of Pennsylvania OR enrolled in an agricultural program at a Pennsylvania college or university.
